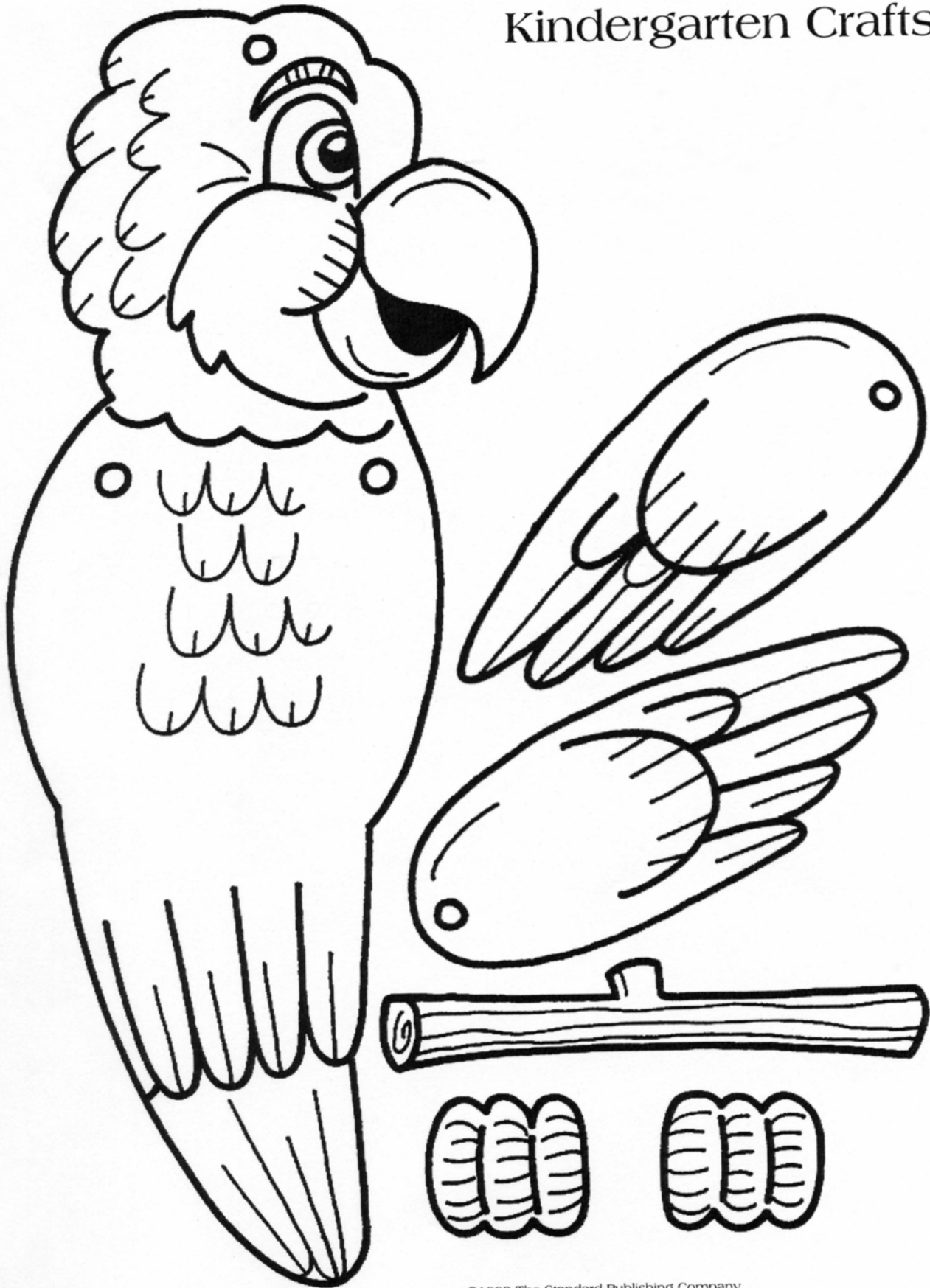
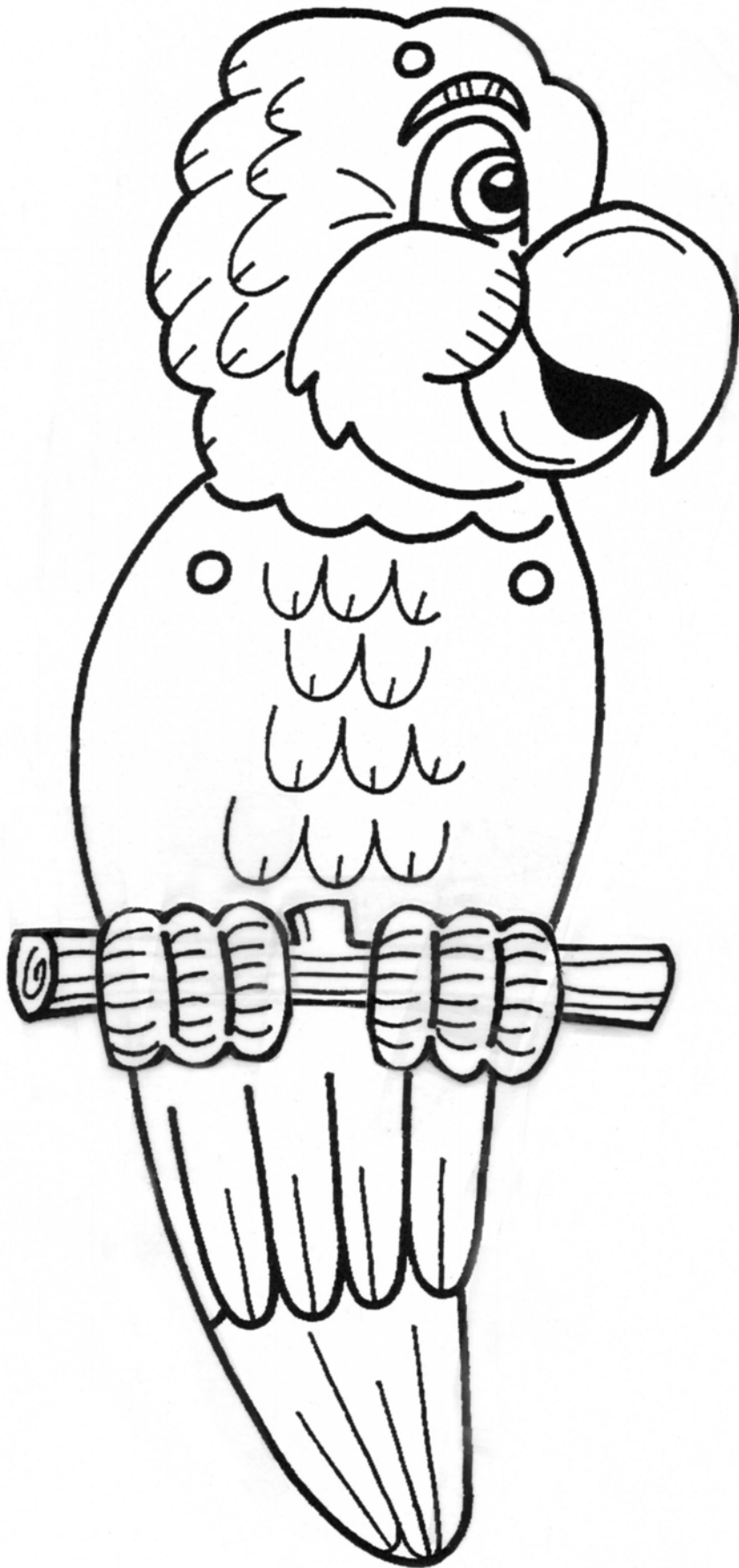


# Kindergarten Crafts



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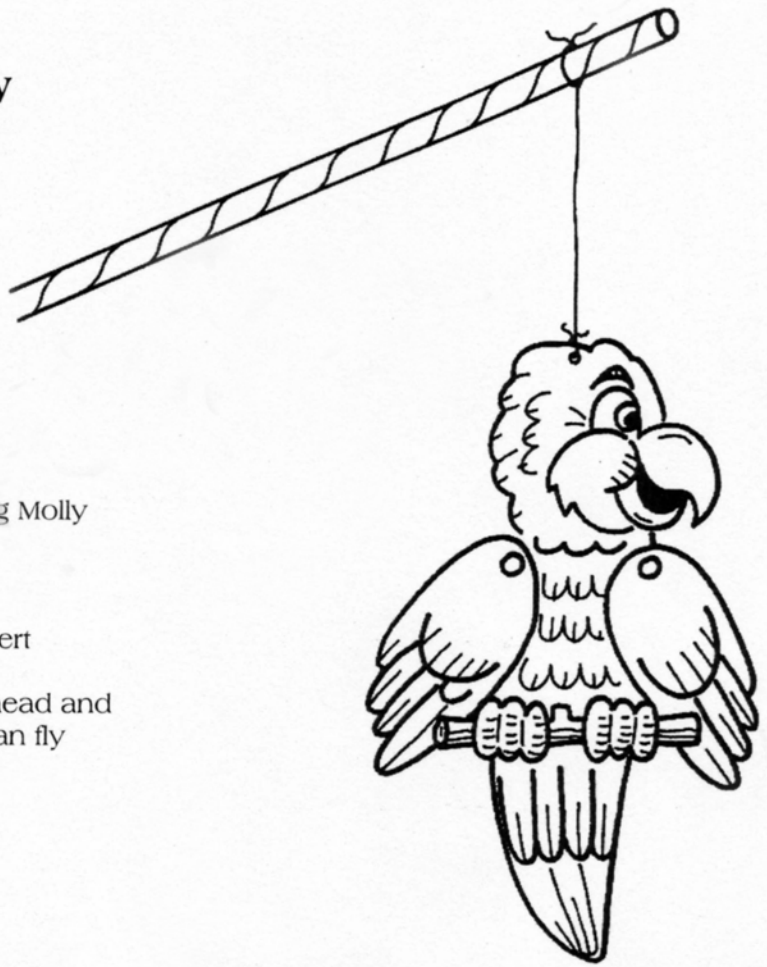
## FLYING MOLLY MACAW

### Materials:

copies of Flying Molly Macaw parts  
two paper fasteners  
crayons or markers  
glue or paste  
scissors  
paper punch  
yarn  
drinking straw

### Here's How:

- Assist the child in cutting out parts of Flying Molly Macaw.
- The child will color the macaw.
- Punch holes where shown by dots.
- Help child line up wings with body and insert fasteners.
- Help him put yarn through the hole in the head and attach the yarn to a drinking straw so he can fly Molly Macaw around and talk to her.



### Hints:

There are two ways to complete this project.

Use page one when you have more time and fewer children.

When there is less time, young or many children use page two.

Also while the straw is nice if you have to transport the supplies for many children you may choose to just use the string/yarn.
